The program will provide senior citizens with assistance on having their blood and water tested, access to a registered dietician to provide counseling on nutrition, and transportation support to the store in order to purchase groceries and other necessities. The program will increase senior citizens' awareness of what is going on with the water crisis.

By the end of the two-year period, senior citizens will be able to make educated decisions because of their increased knowledge.

Kathryn Boles, President, CEO of VAAA says, "The senior citizens in the city of Flint have struggled with the Water Crisis, and we are excited that this new opportunity will help improve the lives of those effected."
